Founders Reflections

Bonnie and I were pleased with both weeks of the 2017 Belize Mission Project (BMP) even though it rained a lot. Special thanks go to Gordon Gates who ran the first week and Phil Bangle for running the second. Of course there were a lot of participants who stepped up to make the project a success. There were new clinic sites that went over well and we will be repeating.

This year we did something that we had never done before. We put a street value on the work done while using average US stats. Dentistry did 978,726.00 US dollars, medicine treated patients at a value of 57,125.00 dollars with only one physician this year, and the total for audiology was 199,010.00 dollars giving a grand total of 1,234,145.00 US dollars.

This is a lot of effort for the two weeks we were there. It shows that the people who go are dedicated and work very hard to help as many lives as they can. People come on the BMP year after year in order to help and to get the self satisfaction it gives one.

If you have never tried to give yourself away I would urge you to give it a try. People first come thinking they are just going to help someone else, and they do. But they end up getting so much more in return in the form of satisfaction with life. People come for a variety of reasons but most find it helps with the stresses of life and it helps give them grounding into what is really important. You become your own psychologist. So if you haven't been on such an adventure I urge you to give it a try. You **WILL** be transformed. We are always looking for dental related people, especially dentists, we need more physicians, and audiology always has a big need. So what are you waiting for? Marc has been a periodontist since 1998 practicing in St. Cloud, Minnesota. Sara has a degree in Human Development and Family Life and a Master Degree in Theology. They have five children, all of whom have been to Belize two times. Two of their children were adopted from Haiti. Marc started going on the BMP in 2009 and Sara has been for the past two years. Sara is also a writer, a speaker, and has a parenting blog. Bonnie and I are delighted and honored to be making this announcement.

With this in mind, Gordy and Jan Gates, Phil Bangle, Marc and Sara, Courtney and Beau McFarlin (our daughter and son-in-law who do the web site), Bonnie and I met in St. Louis for a day meeting to discuss the BMP. 

Jordan Snyder, hygienist, had one of those experiences this year. "Two years ago I met a boy with really messed up teeth and his mother wanted us to pull them out. However, we advised her not to and some of the dentists on the trip put funds together to give him braces. We lost contact with him over the last two years...this year I was at a school with over 400 kids. As I was leaving a little boy came up to me to hug me and it was him.



By God's grace he recognized me, came up to me and pointed at his teeth. They were straight! When I first met him two years ago he would not smile, covered his mouth, and had a hard time eating. When I saw him this year he got his life and confidence back and is able to be a kid. It is crazy that you never know how much you are influencing or changing someone's life."

MEDICAL TEAM

Dr. Craig Holzem shares his passion and experience as a long-time participant. "We went on our first BMP in 1994 as a one time experience. We were so blown away we have been back every year since then with the exception of one. I'll be the first to admit that as a physician I was starting to get burnt out and frustrated with the current medical climate. It seemed that medicine had become little more than assembly line care with filling out forms or appeasing insurance companies. On top of that, patient's expectations continue to rise to greater and greater levels often leaving you tired and unappreciated.

Belize changed all of that.

I was able to practice real medicine. I did the best I could with what I had and patients were happy and appreciative. I received more "God bless you"s in one week in Belize than I get in a year in private practice. I know my patients do appreciate me at home, but if I am not there they could be seen by one of my partners, the group next door or down the street, the Urgi-care or Emergency room. In some of the places I have been to in Belize I may be the only doctor they will see for another year or longer. Belize has become a second home and part of our life an as long as our health remains good we will continue to make the journey."

Audiology Team

The Audiology Team brought new enthusiasm for their efforts with the inclusion of three audiology students. Nathan Romero recounts his experience, "At the "Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports," one of my roles was to do patient assessment. In the waiting area, there was an adorable 7-year-old girl waiting alone. After introducing myself in sign language, she stared at me with a stationary look as if I was from another planet. Tears start to build on the corner of her eyes, followed by a river of tears. She was born with a degree of hearing loss. Buddy removed an impression mold to



be made into a custom ear piece for her new hearing aids. You could see she was nervous at this point. Once the programming stage was completed the hearing aids were turned on. Her eyes lit up like a Christmas tree. Quickly, she began to produce vocal noise; finally, she could hear herself.







The next step is the process of speech therapy and aural rehabilitation. This is where I had the opportunity to exercise what I had learned as an undergrad student and apply it to practice; teaching speech discrimination sounds with tactile cues, by placing her hands over her neck to feel for vocal fold vibration, distinguishing between voiced and voiceless consonants. I was shocked and moved by how quickly she had progressed in 25 minutes of speech therapy. Most of all, I was shocked on how her emotions switched from being frightened and confused to enthusiastic. This is when I realized how great of a need there is in Belize for amplification, speech therapy, dental and health care."
